*News Flash: Beit Shalom to skip book of Leviticus this Year!*

Rabbi Shoshana Kaminsky has shocked Beit Shalom members by announcing that, with the endorsement of the synagogue's ritual committee, she will skip reading through the book of Leviticus this year when it rolls around in March. "It's lost its appeal," she confided. "I've been reading through it for more than twenty years now, and I've just run out of interesting things to say."

The loss of Torah readings for one-fifth of the year poses an unprecedented challenge to find replacement texts. Rabbi Kaminsky has confirmed that she will not jump ahead to the book of Numbers. "That's not all that interesting either," she declares, "and the second half of the book of Exodus is also really dry. It's a bit of a dilemma." Although planning is underway, it is anticipated that the rabbi will simply go back to the start of the book of Genesis, which everyone knows is where all the good stuff is anyway.

When asked to justify this radical move, members of the ritual committed point to a number of synagogues based in California which have rejected 2000 years of practice and are now only reading "the nice bits" from the Torah. These congregations have seen their weekly attendance jump, and their members report a 20% improvement in their general sense of well-being. "Honestly, none of us have any regrets," a member of the ritual committee shared, and then asked to remain anonymous. The ritual team is also said to be considering doing away with weekly Torah readings altogether and substituting readings by contemporary celebrities instead. "Oprah's autobiography is meant to be quite inspiring," says Rabbi Kaminsky. "I'm thinking of creating a monthly Oprah Shabbat where we study her sacred texts. I really think we're starting to move in the right direction."

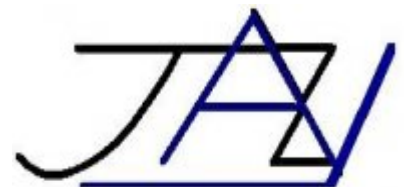

## President's Report ידיעה מיושב הראש

This President's report, I am pleased to share with you that yet another member of Beit Shalom has been honoured, this time for a commitment to multiculturalism and harmony. Ron Hoening was shortlisted for the Governor's Multicultural Awards for his commitment and participation in a range of multicultural activities. Mazel Tov to you Ron for this recognition! I would like to share with everyone the nomination for this award. I am sure you will all agree that this recognition is well deserved.

Ron Hoenig has demonstrated a commitment to the promotion of multiculturalism and community harmony in both his career and volunteer capacities. This can be traced back to 1977 when he was tutoring new migrants in English as a second language. Ron also taught orientation English to Vietnamese refugees and lectured in English for adult migrant medical professionals. Ron continued a professional connection to multiculturalism as the Director of the Multicultural Arts Trust from 1989 - 1996. In this role, Ron coordinated and promoted programs of multicultural arts support, managed the State Bank Multicultural Carnival and initiated and project managed the Multicultural Arts Trust Media Award. Ron also produced, wrote and edited *Traditions and Visions and Synapse*.

In a volunteer capacity Ron has demonstrated his commitment to cultural harmony through his membership in a range of organisations. In 1989 and again in 1994 Ron was a member of the Multicultural Sector, SA Arts Industry Training Council. From 1989 to 1990, he was on the Advisory Board of the Migration Museum. From 1990 to 1995 Ron was involved in the Community Arts Network undertaking Chairperson and Secretary Roles. Ron was also the Chairperson of the South Australian Multicultural Arts Network from 1992-1994.

A long standing congregant of Beit Shalom Synagogue, Ron joined the Board of Beit Shalom in 2000 and is currently the Vice President. Interfaith relations is one of Ron's Beit Shalom portfolios. Ron is also a member of the Australian Council of Christians and Jews and has been the Deputy Chair of this organisation since 2008. Ron was part of an Australian delegation at the International Council of Christians and Jews Conference in Jerusalem in 2008 and coordinated a Council of Christians and Jews tour of Israel earlier this year.

Ron has promoted multiculturalism in his appearances on the Multicultural Arts spot on 5AN and the Multicultural Arts Trust programme. He has also written many press articles and media releases for the Multicultural Arts Trust. Ron completed a Thesis, titled 'Reading Alien Lips: print media depictions of lips sewing by asylum seekers and the conflict over national identify'. Ron has made presentations on his Thesis at the New Antiracisms Conference (Sydney, 2006), the Cultural Studies Association of Australia (Adelaide, 2007), Australia Critical Race and Whiteness Studies Association (Adelaide, 2007 and 2009), and Friends of the Hebrew University (Adelaide, 2007). He has also made presentations to undergraduate students in Ethics in Communications at the University of South Australia from 2006 to 2010. A chapter based on Ron's Thesis was published in a book 'The Racial Politics of Bodies, Nations and Knowledges' edited by Barbara Baird and Damien W. Rigges (published 2009).

As the son of Holocaust survivors, Ron is a deeply sensitive person, attuned to the pain and suffering of other minority groups. Through his work and volunteering, Ron has demonstrated a lifetime commitment to making our community a more harmonious place to live.

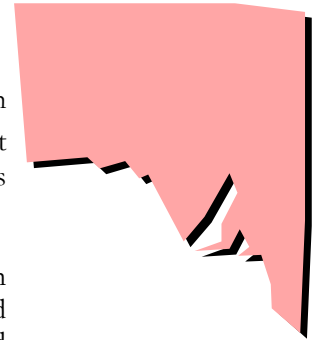
## *Celebrate SA*

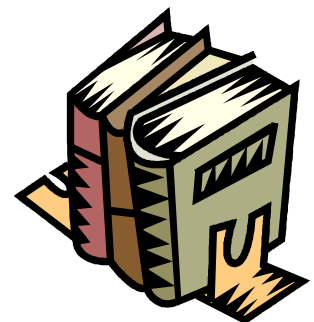

## More Purim Humour

### *"Rafi's Rules of Non-Parliamentary Procedure*

### *Specifically for the Orderly conduct of Jewish Meetings"*

So that all Jewish meetings may be conducted in an orderly manner, with due respect for propriety and dignity, the following rules are hereby established by as close to universal consent as anything Jewish ever gets:

- **POINT OF PERSONAL OUTRAGE.** At any time during a meeting when a participant becomes extremely upset, he or she shall have the right to interrupt any other speaker, will not be required to wait for recognition from the Chair, and has the obligation to speak at a volume considerably higher than required for normal conversation.
- **POINT OF IRRELEVANT INJERJECTION:** Irrespective of the motion on the floor, the participant shall have the right to monopolize the meeting for not more than five minutes as he or she discourses on a point the relevance of which escapes all other participants.
- **POINT OF PERSONAL ATTACK:** In response to a point raised by another speaker, the participant shall have the right to reply by launching a personal attack against the speaker. At no time shall the substance of the point itself be addressed.
- **POINT OF ASSOCIATIVE GUILT:** The participant shall have the right to impugn the Jewishness of any other Jew by alleging that he or she is, was, might be, has a third cousin who is, or may have great-grandchildren who will belong to any and all organizations designated by the participant as dedicated to the destruction of Israel and/or the Jewish people.
- **POINT OF CONTEMPT:** The participant shall have the right to grumble, throw papers down on the table, shake his or her head vigorously, or otherwise demonstrate contempt for the proceedings and other participants in the meeting.
- **POINT OF HARASSMENT:** The participant shall have the right to introduce irrelevant motions for the sole purpose of delaying the meeting. It is only permissible to resort to a point of harassment when the outcome of an imminent vote is obvious and is likely to go against the wishes of the participant introducing the point of harassment.
- **POINT OF REDUNDANT INFORMATION:** This is not to be confused with the more familiar "point of information." A Point of Redundant Information entitles the participant to tell those in the meeting something they already know. Example: "I want to remind everyone that a synagogue is a religious institution!"
- **POINT OF REDUNDANCY:** This is a motion that entitles the participant to make a point made by another participant no more than five speakers earlier. It must be introduced by saying "My point was already made, but..." or "I agree with what was said earlier, but just want to say..."
- **POINT OF PIOUS POSTURING:** This motion entitles the participant to make references to any teaching in the Bible or rabbinic literature that allegedly supports his or her point of view. A correct quotation, however, immediately disqualifies the point. Example: "As it says in the Bible, if we are only for each other, who will be for me?"
- **POINT OF GRUDGE:** Entitles the participant to raise an issue debated and decided by the organization not less than five years earlier, for which the participant has not yet forgiven those involved. Example: "I just want to remind this board that I was opposed to the idea of hiring a rabbi at all when it first came up ten years ago."

Scrambled up in matzo brie!

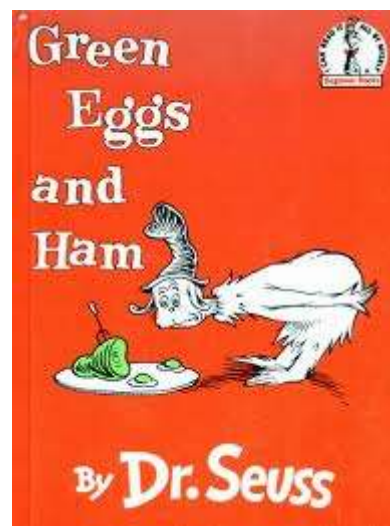

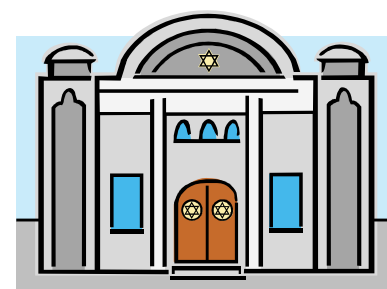
